COVID-19 PROTOCOLS FOR SUMMER CAMP
AS OF 2/23/22**

While the NY State Department of Health has yet to issue its 2022 protocols for summer camping in the midst of COVID-19, it's reasonable to expect that those protocols will be similar to 2021's. In anticipation of this, until directed otherwise, LCLC plans to adhere to the following safety protocols for the 2022 camping season.

- A negative COVID test result from 1-3 days prior to your arrival will be required.
- Temperatures will be taken upon arrival. Campers with a fever or COVID symptoms will be asked to return home.
- Campers will be able to go mask free in all outdoor areas and when inside their cabins with their cabin cohort.
- Campers from one cabin cohort will be able to intermix with campers from other cohorts, mask free, when outdoors.
- Intermixing of camper cohorts inside the dining hall will not occur, unless masked. For mealtimes, campers will eat with their cabin cohort while spaced out six feet from other cohorts. Aside from mealtimes, the indoor space of the dining hall will not be used as a gathering space for activities.
- Frequent hand washing and sanitizing will occur before and after meals and all activities that use high-touch items.
- Daily temperature and COVID symptom checks will continue once daily.
- Camper capacities will remain reduced from their 2019 capacities as follows
 - 7-12th Grade: 8 per cabin
 - 4th-6th Grade: 7 per cabin
 - Mini Camp: 6 per cabin

We hope these protocols give you both a sense of security and a sense of freedom to experience camp at its best. With the guidance of the Department of Health, we're confident that we'll reach a balance of safety and fun this summer. We're looking forward to a healthy summer.
